PROSPECTUS

The Capital Law College was established in the year 1982 in the heart of the State Capital Bhubaneswar. It is one of the pioneer legal institution in the state of Odisha and is imparting 5 years Integrated B.A.LL.B (Hons.) course with approval of affiliation from the State Govt. of Odisha. It has also permission by the Bar Council of India. The college is affiliated to Madhusudan Law University, Cuttack w.e.f the session 2021-22as per the notification of State Govt.

The college is functioning in its own building and situated on the side of National Highway N.H – 5 in the Plot No.- A/63, Nayapalli, CRP Square, Bhubaneswar – 751003. The classes will be held from 8.00A.M to 12Noon on every working day.

NUMBER OF SEATS

The intake capacity for the 5years Integrated B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) Programme shall be 60nos.

AGE LIMIT

The age criteria for this course is Minimum 18 Years and Maximum 22 Years for General candidates whereas it is Maximum 25 years in case of SC/ST candidates, However, if the candidate is over aged by six months, he will seek permission from the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for taking admission.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

An applicant who has successfully completed Senior Secondary School Programme (10+2)/ or appearing in +2 or equivalent from a recognized University of India or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by the State Government, shall be eligible for entrance examination in to 5 Year B.A.LL.B. (Honours) Course. The Candidate belonging to the general (Unreserved) category shall have to secure at least 45% of the total marks in aggregate and the candidates belonging to SC/ST category shall have to secure at least

40% of the total marks in aggregate for admission in to the course (original certificates along with photo copies to be submitted at the time of the counselling). There shall be no relaxation of marks in minimum eligibility for admission. Such minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission.

ADMISSION FEE

Each candidate shall have to pay an annual fees Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) only. This fees is payable at the time of admission in cash or in shape of Bank Draft deposited in any Nationalized Bank drawn in favor of the Principal payable at Bhubaneswar .

The amount would include Admission Fees, Tuition Fees, Library Fees, Establishment and Contingency Charges and all other relevant fees. However , a candidates has to pay all fees connected with Examination separately.

RESERVATION

Reservation of seats will be as follows:

Scheduled Caste [SC] & Scheduled Tribe [ST]

- SC-16.25% of the sanctioned strength of each course shall be reserved for SC applicants
- ST-22.5% of the sanctioned strength of each course shall be reserved for ST applicants. The reserved seats are not interchangeable between SC & ST. SC/ST applicants selected for admission on their merit shall not be counted against reserved seats
- Seats under reserved category will be de-reserved if no students of that category are available for admission.

Persons with Disability (PwD)

- 5% of sanctioned seats shall be reserved for PwD candidates with extent of disability not below 40% (Blind and Low Vision, Hard of Hearing, Locomotors Disability including Cerebral Palsy, Leprosy Cured, Dwarfism, Acid Attack Victims and Muscular Dystrophy, Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness).

Ex-Serviceman [ESM], Serving Defense Personnel [SDP], Children of Martyrs [CoM]

- 1% of the sanctioned seats shall be reserved for Self/ Children/ Wife/ Husband/ of Ex-Serviceman, Serving Defence Personnel and Children of Martyrs.

However, any modification made by the Government of Odisha in the reservation policy will be followed during admission in letter and spirit.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The candidate seeking admission into 5 - Year B.A.LL.B (Hons) Degree Course shall apply in the prescribed form available in the college office. The copy of the filled in application form along with the application fee receipt of Rs. 1,000/- should be brought at the time of admission.

Application form duly filled up by the candidate should reach the Principal on or before the last date fixed for submission of forms. The institution shall not be held responsible for Postal delay.

The copies of the following documents must be submitted along with the application

- a) H.S.C or equivalent certificate with Mark-sheet
- b) +2 or equivalent certificate with Mark-sheet
- c) For reservation candidate (SC/ ST) must be attached Caste Certificate
- d) One Passport Size Photograph
- e) Original Money Receipt of the Application Form
- f) Requisite Postal Stamp in the Intimation letter.

CERTIFICATES & DOCUMENTS

Students selected shall produce the following documents and original certificate at the time of admission for verification.

1. College Leaving Certificate from the college last attended.
2. 3 Nos. Passport size recent photographs
3. Intimation Letter
4. Original Certificate from H.S.C to onwards
5. Original Mark-sheet for verification
6. Migration certificate in case of students from any University other than M.S. Law University
7. Requisite fees as mentioned in the Intimation Letter
8. No admission without CLC and time extension for admission is not allowed

DURATION OF SEMESTER

The duration of Five Years Integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons) course shall be of ten semesters (five academic years). The course leading to Five Year Integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons) shall be conducted in semester system in not less than 18 weeks with not less than 36 lecture hours per week including tutorials, moot court exercise, seminars etc. provided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours.

ATTENDANCE

No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the end semester examination in a subject if she/he has not attended at least 75% of classes in all the subjects taken together for each semester, including the moot court exercises, tutorials and practical training.

INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS FEES

Each candidate shall have to pay an Internal Examination fees Rs.1,000/- (Rupees One Thousand) only at the time of Admission./ Re-admission for 02nos Semesters.

UNIVERSITY REGD. FEES

Rs. 200/- will be paid at the time of admission towards Univ. Regd. Fees at the time of Admission.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) course has been designed in accordance to the standards and regulations prescribed by the UGC and BCI (Rules of Legal Education – 2008 of Bar Council of India) from time to time. B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Degree shall be awarded to the candidates on successful completion of ten semesters. In ten semesters, there shall be 60 papers with 6 papers in each semester carrying 100 marks. The course structure of the programme will have 240 credits in ten semesters.

The Five- Year Integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Program offered is in complete conformity with the Bar Council of India Guidelines:

SYSTEM OF EXAMINATION

Each course paper shall be of 100 marks. For evaluation, the overall structure of the distribution of marks in end semester examination shall be such that 30 Marks shall be allotted to Internal Assessments during the semester, while 70 marks shall be allotted for the End semester Examinations. For theory and practical, the examination system shall be different as per details given below:

A. Internal Assessment

The distribution of the marks for the Internal Assessment is given below:

Internal Assessment	30 Marks
Mid-Semester test	15 marks
Written Assignment/Moot court exercise	10 marks (5 marks for Written Assignment & 5 marks for oral presentation)
Attendance	5 marks

The mid-semester examination shall consist of two questions from first two Units and the candidate is required to answer one question carrying 15 marks.

The date for the mid-term examinations shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.

The distribution of marks for the attendance is given below:

Attendance	Marks allotted
76%-80%	2 Marks
81%-85%	3 Marks
86%-90%	4 Marks
91% above	5 Marks

Where a candidate fails to take examinations in any one of more subjects or has failed to secure the minimum pass marks in one or more papers or in aggregate, her/his internal assessment marks shall be carried forward to the subsequent examinations.

In case, any candidate fails to secure 50 percent marks in the internal assessment, she/he shall appear in the next respective semester (even with even or odd with odd i.e., first, third, fifth seventh and ninth/ second fourth, sixth, eight and tenth.)

B. End Semester Examination and evaluation for 70 Marks.

The Controller of Examinations, Madhusudan Law University shall notify the examination schedule on completion of courses.

The question paper will have five questions. Question 1 is compulsory and shall have four short questions from all the four Units and each question carries 3.5 marks. The paper setter is required to set other eight questions with two questions from each Unit i.e. Unit I to Unit IV. The candidate shall have to attempt four questions, selecting one question from each Unit. Each question carries 14 Marks.

C. Practical Courses

For the practical courses, i.e., Alternative Dispute Resolution; Professional Ethics; Drafting, Pleading and Conveyancing the distribution of marks for the examination shall be as follows:

End semester	48 marks
Mid-semester	7 Marks
Attendance	5 Marks
Practical	40 marks (20 marks for written assignment and 20 marks forVivavoce).

Both the assignment and viva-voce shall be evaluated by the committee constituted by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.

D. Moot Court Exercise and Internship:

This paper shall have three components of 30 marks each and a viva for 10 marks.

- a) Moot Court (30 Marks): Every Candidate shall be required to do at least three moot courts exercises in the semester with 10 marks for each. The moot court work will be on assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.
- b) Observance of Trial in two cases one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks): Candidates shall be required to attend two trials during ninth semester of the course. They shall maintain a proper record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court in a practical file. This scheme will carry 30 marks.

- c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and Internship diary (30 marks): Each student shall observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the Lawyer's Office/Chamber and record the proceedings in a diary and relevant forms, which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in the diary, which will carry 15 marks. Each candidate shall submit such prepared diary to the HoD at the time of viva-voce. HoD shall later on dispose of such evaluated diaries.
- d) The proof to the effect that the candidate has attended the chamber/office of the advocate/counsel shall submit the certificate issued by the respective advocate/counsel, clearly indicating the dates of joining and leaving of office.
- e) The fourth component of this paper will be viva-voce examination on all the above three aspects. This will carry 10 marks. f) This paper shall be evaluated by a committee constituted by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
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E. The Credit System

The Course has 6 papers in each semester and each paper is having 4 credits, Then the total credit for the paper of the semester shall be calculated as 4 credit per paper. (For example, Credit per paper x Number of papers = 24 credits per semester).

The Grade value shall mean the value assigned to the marks obtained by a Candidate in a paper. Grade value is based on ten-point scale.

The table given below shows the marks range, grade value and corresponding letter grade.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION

A candidate admitted in 5years Integrated B.A.LL.B (Hons) course must have to enrolls himself to the 1st semester examination for which he/ she is illegible at the 1st chance after which he/ she shall be entitled to appear the back examination of that semester and other subsequent examination.
